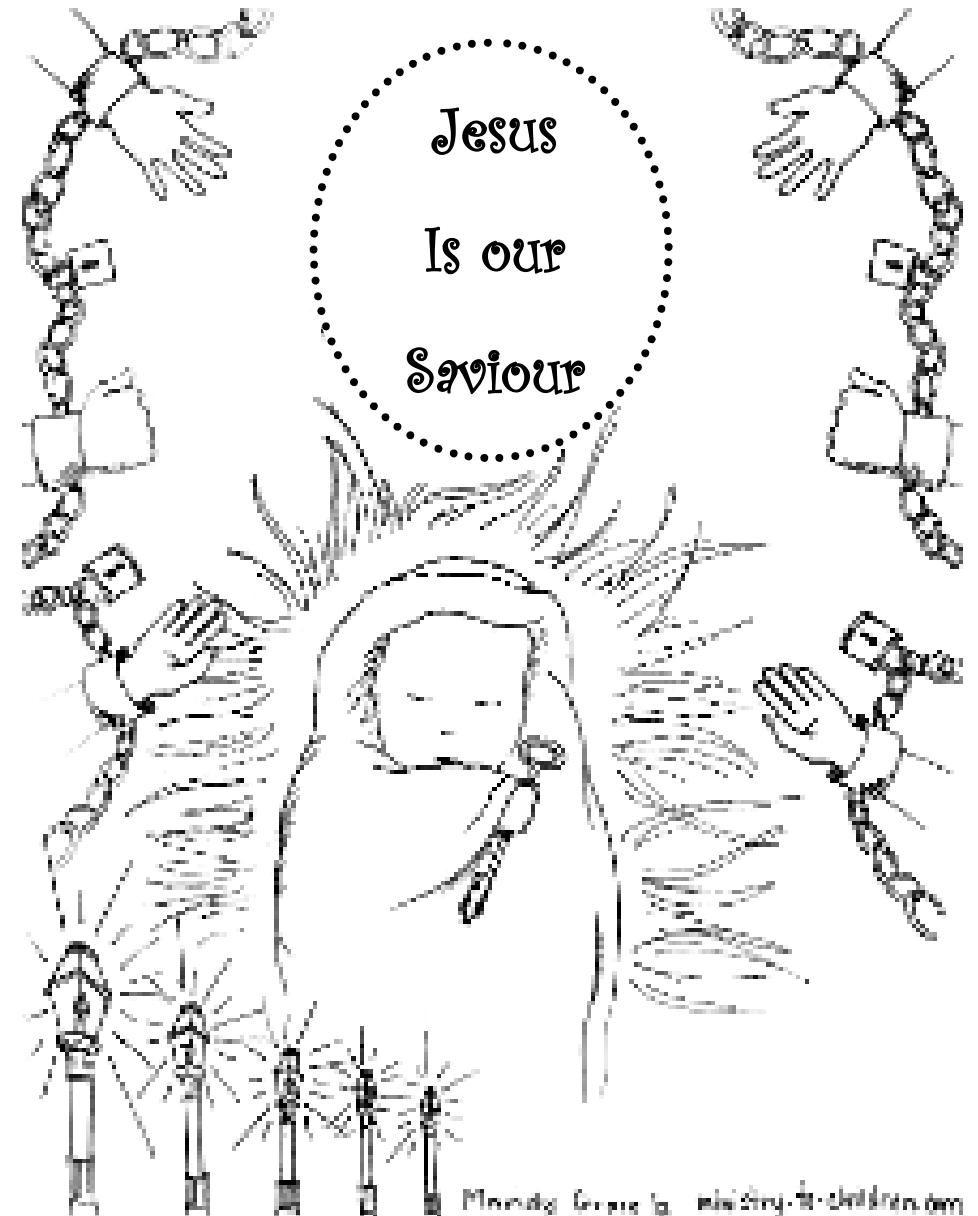

MUSINGS: Midnight Mass Luke 2: 1-14

And she gave birth to her firstborn, a son... (Lk 2:7)

In the Gospel accounts of Jesus' birth we don't hear anything of what Mary, might have gone through giving birth in a smelly, cold stable on that starry night. We have sanitised it. Why?
